Your endowed fund establishes an incredible legacy of care for children today and in the future. From wrap-around support for families to lifechanging research to caring for the staff who care for kids, we remain steadfast in our dedication to the wellbeing of all children because of you.

This year, thanks to community champions like you, Children's Mercy took the lead for kids and made huge strides in our mission to provide hope, healing and answers for families, including:

- Illuminate opening the Depression and Anxiety in Youth (DAY) clinic to treat those conditions using cognitive behavioral therapy, and breaking ground on a 72-bed mental wellness campus in a joint venture with Camber Mental Health.
- Patient Progression Hub in its first year, decreased patient delays by 86% and emergency department boarding by 99%, ensuring children get the treatment they need as quickly and efficiently as possible.
- **Optical genome sequencing** Children's Mercy is the first pediatric hospital in the U.S. to use OGM in the clinical setting to detect and diagnose genetic disorders and cancers.



City Lights and KC Nights


This year Children's Mercy Patient Prom made a joyous comeback in May, as about 120 patients and their guests danced the night away at the Children's Mercy Research Institute.

"So many of our patients can't go to their own high school prom; maybe it's because of their diagnosis, or they have a really low immune system, or they don't feel comfortable with the medical situation they have going on, so we're providing them a safe space," said Trista Cobbins, MA, CCLS, Manager, Patient and Family Programs.

"We try to make it as close to a high school prom as possible. We just want them to have fun and enjoy something that is such a rite of passage for high school students."

Prom goers prepared for the festivities by donning dresses and tuxedos donated by the community. Volunteers provided on-site alterations and free hair and make-up sessions.

"Without our community partners, we could not host events like prom. The donors, vendors and volunteers who generously give their time, supplies and energy make this wonderful event happen for our patients," Trista said.
